#### **HEATING OIL PRICE TRENDS**

According to the U.S.
Energy Information
Administration (EIA)
responses to COVID-19
and the mitigation efforts
to stop its spread have
significantly affected energing



significantly affected energy price and consumption patterns in 2020.

If you are like a typical U.S. energy consumer, the COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in an increase in your residential energy use (such as powering electric appliances and space cooling/heating) but has decreased your use of transportation-related energy.

With more of us working and attending school from home this year, the U.S. Energy Information Administration (EIA) expects there will be an increased demand for space heating at any given temperature relative to past winters.

The good news is that heating oil prices are expected to trend slightly down this winter, which may help offset the costs incurred by any increase in consumption.
